COMPUTATION METHOD FOR MAX. BENEFIT
TTD, Total & Permanent, Amputation and Eye Enucleation:

State AWW multiplied by 133.3333%

Maximum Death Benefit
 (For injuries occurring prior to 2/1/06):
 365 days x 20 years = 7,300 days
 7,300 days + 5 (leap year days) = 7,305 days
 7,305 days / 7 = **1,043.5714 weeks x TTD rate**

Maximum Death Benefit
 (For injuries occurring on or after 2/1/06):
 365 days x 25 years = 9,125 days
 9,125 days + 6 (leap year days) = 9,131 days
 9,131 days / 7 = **1,304.428 weeks x TTD | Death Rate**

The current state mileage rate is 54 cents per mile.

SB 1283 (Public Act 94-0695) Summary

Effective date changed for increases for disfigurement and specific loss of scheduled body parts

Public Act 94-277, effective July 20, 2005, increased the maximum number of weeks for disfigurement under Section 8(c) of the Act and specific loss of scheduled body parts under Section 8(e) of the Act. SB 1283 changes the effective dates of these provisions as follows:
